Agricultural / Lawn & Garden Tractor - Would you like to drive a tractor, learn safety, and maintenance? This can be a poster or you may do the driving contest.

ATV Safety - Do you enjoy riding or watching ATVs? Learn how to safely operate ATVs.

Aquatic Science - Do you love to raise fish? Build an aquarium, buy fish, food, plants, and etc.

Arts & Crafts - Create items to be worn or displayed in the home. Categories include: Fine Arts, Legos, Miscellaneous Crafts, Model Building, or Needlecraft.

Cake Decorating - Learn how to decorate cakes for special occasions.

Cats - Caring for a cat regardless of breeding, type, etc. Study health and grooming in preparation for showing at the fair.

Child Development - Understand young children through play activities.

Collections - Do you have a cool collection? Then show it off at the County Fair and tell us about it!

Computer - Learn to use commercial software, solve problems with the computer, and write custom programs.

Consumer Clothing - Love to buy clothes? Learn clothing care, wardrobe planning, and how to make wise purchases.

Creative Writing - Explore your writing talents, through poetry, short stories, biographies and more.

Crops - Learn about production and marketing of the following crops: Corn, Hay and Forages, Small Grains (Oats and Wheat), or Soybeans.

Dog Obedience - Teach your dog basic exercises like sit and stay through weekly workshops.

Dog Agility - Train your dog to maneuver through an obstacle course

Dog Showmanship - Learn to show your dog based on its breed.

Electricity - Learn what electricity is, how it is controlled, and how to use it safely. Workshop provided.

Entomology - Collect and learn about individual insects of Indiana.

Farm Toy Scene - Create a realistic custom built farm toy display.



Floriculture - Learn how to grow and arrange flowers.

Foods - Want to learn how to bake cookies or make a pie or can vegetables from your own garden? We offer both baking and preservation

Forestry - Learn how to identify trees, uses and benefits of trees, and the importance of woodlands.

Gardening - Learn how to grow garden produce.

Genealogy - Trace your family history to find out who your ancestors were, where they lived, and interesting facts about them.

Geology - Do you love to collect rocks? Learn about individual rocks, minerals, and fossils.

Gift Wrapping - Learn to wrap packages that suit different occasions; including paper selection and bow-making.

Health - Study and practice of good health habits.

Home Environment - Design your home and learn about the care of home furnishings.

Junior Leader - Experiences include county and local activities that assist in leadership development. (Member must be in grades 7-12)

Memory Book - A scrapbook / record of what you have accomplished in 4-H.

Music - Develop an appreciation for music, it's genre, theories and different artist.

Photography - Picture this!! Develop the basic skills of taking the perfect picture, lighting and flash, photo composition approaches, sequencing and evaluating.

Recycling - One persons junk is another persons treasure! Use discarded items to make a treasure unique to you.

Sewing - Want to make your own clothes or clothes for your favorite doll? Develop sewing skills required to construct a *wearable or non-wearable* item.

Scrapbook - Preserve your memories in an organized and creative way.

Shooting Sports - Do you like to hunt?? We offer all types of firearms and archery safety and shooting techniques.

Small Animals: Pets-Learn proper care and feeding of your selected small pet (cannot fit in any other 4-H project category-dogs, cats, rabbits, etc.).

Small Engine: ¹/₁₆ Model Tractor Pulling - Micro-Mini Tractor Pulling is a ¹/₁₆ scale version of full size tractor pulling. A weight transfer sled is pulled by these small "toy" pullers on a 2'x16' wooden track. Some of these pulling units in the 6 lb. open modified tractor class have been known to pull in excess of 600 lbs.

Soil and Water Science - Did you know there are different types of soil? Learn all about these types and layers that make up of Earth.

Sport Fishing - Learn about types of lures, fishing locations, boat and water safety, and other aspects of fishing.

Sports - What do you like to play? Can you explain why they do a certain play or routine? Then help other understand by doing a poster about it!

Vet Science - Want to be a vet? This project will help you learn about animal health and disease.

Weather and Climate Science - Study the weather, its effects, and what causes it to change; observe and record weather conditions; make simple instruments to be used in weather observation.

Wildlife - Can you name all the wildlife in Indiana? Learn about wildlife identification, habitats, food chains, management, and careers.

Woodworking - Learn proper use of woodworking tools to develop skills necessary for making wood items.

LIVESTOCK PROJECTS
Beef, Dairy, Goats, Horse & Pony, Poultry, Rabbits, Sheep, and Swine—Learn about selecting, raising and showing

beef; dairy cattle; dairy, Boer, & pygmy goats; horses, chickens, waterfowl (ducks and geese), turkeys, and / or guinea fowl; rabbits; sheep; and / or swine.
