2018-14-186 PROJECT UPDATES

Updates on on-going projects were provided as follows:

Property Update

The closing on the purchase of Lots 175 and 176, with Mr. and Mrs. Chumley was completed on Wednesday, October 10, 2018.

Dr. Smith is working with school attorney, Stu Weliver, to identify a closing date on the property located at 602 Market Street.

CTE Automotive Facility Remodeling

The design manager is currently working to complete the design phase, in order to begin the process of bidding out the project.

A subsurface investigation was recently conducted on the site by Alt and Witzig Engineering, of Montezuma, Indiana. While they have submitted their written findings, a review of said findings has been requested. The superintendents of the four (4) school corporations involved with the program, will meet with Alt and Witzig, on November 14.

In short, we want to ensure that the ground where fill has been added over the years is stable enough for the planned new construction.

District Office Project

A final design layout has been identified, with Mr. Randy Grubbs, River Group, and the CCSC construction manager, who presented the board with the layout. The identified design provides a functional and efficient set up for daily operations of the corporation, while providing a 1400+ square foot board room, that can also be utilized for professional development sessions, large meetings, and to meet community needs as well. A motion

was made to accept the final design for the CCSC District Office and Board Room as presented.

Contractor for Demolition

Mr. Grubbs has obtained four (4) quotes and proposals for the demolition of the old district office located at 601 Market street:

Campbell's Excavating - \$17,900 D&S Powell - \$19,000 (Estimate) Foust New Finishes - \$19,000 A.J. Hetrick Enterprises - \$31,186

In keeping with our commitment to ensure safety, an 8' High, Pole Driven, Chain Link Fence will be installed, by National Fence Company, during the last week of November. Demolition will begin the first of December, with work to be completed by December 21, 2018. A motion was made to accept the proposal provided by Campbell's Excavating for a price of \$17,900.

2017 Energy Savings Project

In late 2017 Covington Community School Corporation launched a review focused on implementation of an energy savings project. In conjunction, a notification offering interested parties the opportunity to submit proposals was provided to the public.

While formal proposals were submitted, no action was taken to engage with a provider of services. Further, with the path we are now on,

engaging with Steftenagel and Gibraltar, Dr. Smith asked the board for approval to notify those providing proposals that we will not be proceeding with the 2017 Energy Savings Project. A motion was made granting the superintendent permission to notify those providers.

Depository Review

Recently, CCSC launched a review of our current banking services, which included requesting proposals from local banking institutions with interest in servicing our corporation. A total of four (4) proposals were received and following a review, which included face - to - face meetings, it has been determined that The Fountain Trust Company had the best overall proposal, which best suited to serve the needs of CCSC. A motion was made to name The Fountain Trust Company as our public depository, effective 2019.

Band Uniforms

Mr. Calcamuggio presented a proposal for board consideration, related to the purchase of new band uniforms. With the total cost of the uniforms projected to be in the area of \$30,000, the band and band boosters, have raised \$15,000 towards their goal.

Per previous discussions, the school corporation had agreed to provide \$13,000 towards the purchase of the uniforms. The \$13,000 was placed into our budget. A motion was made to approve \$13,000 towards the purchase of new band uniforms.

LED Lighting Projects

During our October meeting, the board approved two (2) LED Lighting Projects. Both projects are set to be executed to between the November and December board sessions. The elementary project will be completed during the week of November 19, with the second project, involving the high school, middle school, middle school gymnasium, and annex scheduled for the week of December 3. The two projects involve the replacement of existing lighting with LED Lights, with energy savings and improved illumination of our facilities serving as our deliverables.

Dr. Smith proposed an update to an administrative guideline in CCSC Policy Number 207 for Workshops and Conferences. The proposed change is focused on allowing the reimbursement of lunch expenses when an individual is attending a workshop or conference that is not an overnight stay. Contracted Bus Bids

Dr. Smith presented a proposal to the board with regards to contracted bus bids. This would allow for the requesting of contracted bus bids for a two-year period, which will include the 2019 - 2020 and 2020 and 2021 school years. The posting of bids is necessary as our current transportation contracts expire at the end of the school year.

The two year period is being requested, rather than the traditional four year contract window of time in order to allow CCSC to conduct an analysis of our current transportation model. The analysis will be performed during the 2019 - 2020 school year and will allow us to better understand if the current model is the best fit for CCSC.

A motion was made to approve the posting notification of Covington Community School Corporations intent to accept and award transportation contracts for a period of two school years, 2019 - 2020 and 2020 - 2021. Bids will be accepted until December 19, 2018.

2018-14-188 SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Pathfinding

The superintendent's advisory council will hold their next meeting on Tuesday, November 13, 2018, beginning at 6:00 p.m. The November meeting is focused on our operational excellence initiatives, with Gibraltar and Steftenagel providing a report out on the facility study status.

A committee of instructors, one from each of our buildings, met on Tuesday, October 30, to launch work on the CCSC E - Learning strategy.

The 2019 - 2020 School Calendar is currently being constructed. The plan is to have board review during the December monthly meeting.

Aligning

For board awareness, the School Fiscal Indicators Committee has approved the initial fiscal indicators for Indiana's school corporations. There are eight (8) Fiscal Indicators, including:

- 1. Average Daily Membership (Student Enrollment);
- 2. Fund Balances;
- 3. Annual Deficit/Surplus;
- 4. Fund Balances as Percent of Expenditures;
- 5. Tuition Support per ADM, Compared to General Fund Expenditures per ADM;
- 6. Revenue by Type;
- 7. Operating Referendum Revenue as Percent of Total Revenue; and
- 8. General Fund Salaries and Benefits as Percent of General Fund Expenditures.

The fiscal indicators are intended, per recent Indiana code changes, to serve as an Early Warning Signal for financially distressed school corporations. Each school corporation will receive their fiscal indicator

dashboard early in 2019.

Thank you to Ms. Kelli Pinkerton and Ms. Marilyn Corey for the committed focus they put forth with the coordination, as well as execution, of the flu shot program this fall. Their efforts are very much appreciated.

Modeling

Dr. Smith expressed appreciation to Mr. J.R. Haskins, athletic director, and his team for the manner in which they provided a first class IHSAA Volleyball sectional last month. It is an honor to have the opportunity to represent the IHSAA by hosting such an event and Dr. Smith stated that Mr. Haskins and his team were well prepared, while representing the state association, and CCSC, in a professional manner.
